

April Speaker

James Lynch QSM is a conservationist and the founder of Zealandia.

He was the President of the Wellington Branch of Forest and Bird from 1991 and promoted the idea of a wildlife sanctuary. In 1993 a feasibility study was



carried out by the Wellington Regional and City Councils. After public consultation in 1994, the idea of a sanctuary was given the go-ahead and the Karori Wildlife Sanctuary Trust was formed to implement the proposed 'mainland island' wildlife sanctuary

Local History

Brenda baker reports:

A warm sunny day was perfect for this group's walk around the Lower Hutt Civic Centre on 31 March. Starting in Laings Road outside the Dowse, we considered how different the outlook would have been 70 years ago. The area now covered by the Town Hall complex would have been houses, the old Horticultural Hall (which burnt down in the 1950's) and the fire station about where the Town Hall now is.

Further along on the corner of Queens Drive (which was not there in 1952) were the Riddiford Baths



which some of us remembered fondly. We walked through St James' graveyard to Woburn Road and down to the Recreation Ground.

One member of the group told how she and her husband were instrumental in bringing up the river boulders which replace the vandalised commemorative plaques that line the driveway. Returning to the Dowse, we visited the Ans Westra exhibition of photographs taken around Lower Hutt in the 1980's.
