We don't want members to miss out on what is promising to be the highlight of our U3A year. If you are having difficulty getting your My Vaccine Pass, here are some suggestions:

- Hutt City Libraries will help library users get their vaccine record. Just turn up with your National Health Indicator (NHI) number and some means of identifying yourself e.g. driver's licence or passport.
- Some pharmacies will help get vaccine records.
 Ring Age Concern at 0800 652 105 to find one of these pharmacies.
- Ministry of Health help line 0800 222 478 has extended their hours – call them for a temporary vaccine record which will expire on the 14th of December. Age Concern suggest you ring after 6 p.m.

As this will be a new experience for us all, it would help if members could arrive a little earlier than usual for the meeting, as there may be delays as we learn how to manage the process.

We encourage you to wear a mask.

Andrew London Songwriter and satirist

U3A Hutt Valley is delighted to welcome Andrew and his wife Kirsten to entertain us on 13th December.



Andrew is a songwriter and satirist who performs most often solo or a duo with Kirsten London on bass.

His songs explore social and political themes and although humour and satire is very much to the fore, poignancy and pathos are often not far away.

He plays at festivals, and functions all round New Zealand, and also in Australia, Norfolk Island and even Saudi Arabia.

He has released over a dozen albums of mostly his own original material – and some with a trio called Hot Club Sandwich.

In responding to U3A Hutt Valley's invitation he wrote:

"I'll bring a salvo of frivolous satire.

I'll bring Kirsten to provide some backup bass and vocals, and she has a decent uppercut in case there's a riot.


Andrew will have CDs available for us to buy on the day, so come prepared.

November Speaker

Gill Jolly, the Natural Hazards and Risk Theme Leader at GNS Science.

Gill studied vulcanology in exotic locations such as Central Africa and the Caribbean, before coming to New Zealand.

Her team studies the



She explained how their studies help Civil Defence plan for potential catastrophes and how they respond to the emergency afterwards.

She used as an example the eruption on Tongariro in November 2012 where there were tourists on the mountain and risks to flights and road transport on the Desert Road.

She also explained the unusual nature of the Kaikoura earthquake, where a whole series of fault lines moved over a short period of time, and outlined the briefing which she would give to Cabinet after such events to held Government develop a response.

We learnt why this team is now well resourced, because while they cannot prevent these events and only partly predict them, they enable us to prepare for them.
