Local History – Brenda Baker reports

Our first outing for the year was in Moera. For most Lower Hutt residents, Moera is a place to be passed through on the way to somewhere else - like the eastern bays. Many will have some familiarity with Randwick Road but not have ventured on to any of the side streets. Try exploring a little more, preferably on foot, and you might be surprised.

The Local History group completed our series on the "four rivers" of Lower Hutt as we followed the third river, the Te Awamutu Stream, for a short distance. Unfortunately, this is not a particularly attractive waterway at low tide but it was interesting to see the streamside plantings have been made in the reserve off York Street.

Our other purpose was to look at the railway houses built by the Railways Department in the 1920's.



The scheme aimed to provide affordable accommodation for railway workers but in Moera the houses were made available to the general population. Some have altered little in the century they have stood while others have been renovated extensively.

It was good to have two new members coming out with the group and we hope to see them on future outings.
