June Speaker Duncan Campbell



VUW Contemporary Chinese Research Centre

It's estimated that by the 1750s more books had been produced in China than in all the rest of the world. What were these books, and how did Chinese people engage with them? Duncan Campbell's illustrated talk will explain

the history of the book in China, and feature one library in the southern Chinese town of Changshu during the closing years of the Ming dynasty (1368 – 1644).

Last month's Speaker "Is Social Media Dumbing Us Down?"

Frank Sligo PhD Emeritus Professor in Communication at Massey University Wellington, spoke



about his research into Adult Literacy. He explained how adult literacy teachers now have a way to work out how literate their students are. He linked low levels of literacy to the spread of misinformation on social media and how important the Christchurch Call was for controlling the spread of extremist content on the internet.

He recommended we use reliable sources of information like newspapers and books instead of dubious websites.
