### **October Speaker**

#### **Cathrine Lloyd MA**

"The Language of Lace".

Cathrine, who is based in Wellington, is a skilled practitioner of embroidery and threadwork. Her work draws on historical embroidery techniques, including goldwork, needle lace, blackwork, appliqué, tambour and stumpwork.



Her talk will cover the social history of French lace from the 17th century to present times

Cathrine studied at the Royal School of Needlework in London, the Lesage embroidery school in Paris, and the embroidery school of Pascal Jouen in Brittany. She completed a City and Guilds Certificate in fabric embellishment in 2013 and has been an invited speaker at Te Papa, and the JC Beaglehole society at Victoria University of Wellington Library.

She completed her MA, entitled "The Language of Lace and Embroidery: from the Court of Louis XIV through to Contemporary Haute Couture", in 2015.

Her recent exhibition "The Disappearing Woman" was shown at Aratoi Museum of Art and History.

## **Local History Group walk on 30 September**

Eleven group members headed into Wellington, despite the unpromising weather, for an exploration of the Thorndon area.

On arriving at the railway station, we looked at the Old Station Bell which was originally made to go on an American style locomotive. Not many locomotives in New Zealand had bells. Later it graced one of the old stations, Thorndon and Lambton, which preceded the current station built in 1937.

The bell no longer has a clapper but one of our members managed quite a significant dong by hitting it with a walking stick. We walked along Thorndon Quay, the



old shoreline and site of the Pipitea Pa.

A small sculpture on the corner of Davis Street recognises the Te Atiawa people.

At this point we reluctantly made the decision not to continue with the planned walk - drizzle and a cold wind made walking unpleasant. We sought shelter in Old St Paul's where a knowledgeable staff member showed us several things of interest. From there we moved to the Thistle Inn, New Zealand's oldest surviving tavern, where we were booked in for lunch.



Many historic photos line the walls and glass panels in the floor allow diners a glimpse of the basement as it once would have been, complete with rat (not real!).

The Thorndon area leaves us much still to be explored at a later date.
