# **October Speaker**

Dr Rebecca McKenzie grew up in Wellington, attending Onslow College then going to Dunedin to complete a BSc(Hons) majoring in Microbiology and Immunology at the University of Otago.



It was here that she found her passion for bacteria. Rebecca received her PhD from Delft University of Technology, The Netherlands, in the department of Bionanoscience under the supervision of Dr. Stan Brouns.

Her thesis involved developing time-lapse microscopy methods to characterise CRISPR-Cas defense - the first known form of adaptive immunity in bacteria.

Earlier this year Rebecca returned to New Zealand and started her current position as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Malaghan Institute of Medical Research where she is working for the Vaccine Alliance Aotearoa New Zealand (VAANZ).

Rebecca will talk to us about the exciting Medical Research being carried out at the Malaghan Institute and provide some insight into her work to set up a pipeline to support research and development of mRNA vaccine technologies in New Zealand.

# Last month's speaker Don Rennie



It was a privilege to have U3A member Don Rennie speak to us about the history of ACC and how it has deviated from the organisation originally envisaged.

The Woodhouse Report of 1967 proposed a "no fault scheme" based on five principles:

- · Community responsibility
- Comprehensive entitlements
- Complete rehabilitation
- Real compensation
- Administrative efficiency

It also abolished the right to sue for damages for personal injury. However, subsequent amendments removed ACC's independence to represent the needs of accident victims and made ACC follow Government policy.

In 1989 the Shipley Government allowed insurers to join the scheme and compete with ACC. However, the 2000 Clark Government stopped private insurers from offering ACC cover.

If the Woodhouse principles had been adopted, ACC now would cover sickness and incapacity from any cause.
