October Speaker – Captain John Brown



Captain John Brown, is a master mariner, and former Wellington Harbour Board pilot and senior Cook Strait ferry master.

Captain Brown grew up in Lower Hutt. He has crossed Cook Strait around 10,000 times, piloted great ships into harbour, and sailed all around the world.

He was one of the first people to get to the Wahine on that fateful day 10th April 1968. On Monday he will give us his views on the Wahine disaster, and if time permits, the proposed Picton rail ferries.

Wellington will need new wharves and ferry terminals for the Interislander's two new ships expected to arrive in 2025. A new Wellington passenger terminal building is planned near the existing one at Kaiwharawhara and a new wharf on reclaimed land next to the railway line.

Last month's speaker Jim Ward - Heartland Bank Reviewed by Kevin Willis

Jim explained that this type of borrowing allows the borrower to improve their standard of living by providing funds for home improvements, medical purposes, to buy a new car or other reasons.



No interest or repayments are payable until the borrower sells the security (e.g. to move into a retirement village) or they die. The advances are insured so the amount repayable does not exceed the sale proceeds of the house.

The average loan is \$87,000 and the average age of borrowers is 73. Some people borrow all of the amount in one lump sum and others have regular payments made to them.

The interest rate is currently 9.75% which is about 2% above the floating mortgage interest rate. This premium is charged because the interest is compounded and paid when the mortgage is repaid.

To date Heartland Bank have settled over 22,000 reverse mortgages and they have about 90% of the market. SBS Bank also make this type of facility available.


Returning to the Dowse
