# April Speaker Dr Sam Dean

Principal Scientist – Climate, NIWA Dr Dean's research identified the contribution of human-induced warming to intensifying current New Zealand weather extremes, including droughts and floods. This contributes to our fundamental



understanding of how the atmosphere responds to climate change, as well as improving our understanding of Antarctic sea ice and its influence on Southern Hemisphere climate.

Dr Dean has a broad and comprehensive knowledge of climate change impacts on New Zealand. Over past 13 years he has been at the forefront of developing future climate change projections specifically for New Zealand.

These projections are actively used by numerous research institutes, government departments and local government councils to better understand, or plan for, the impacts of climate change. In recent years he has contributed to adaptation solutions to expected climate change impacts.
