# May Speaker Robbie van Dam

Co-founder & Design Leader of Goodnature, Robbie has a degree in industrial design.

Concern for critically endangered New Zealand's birds prompted Robbie and co-founder Craig Bond



to set up Goodnature - with a little help from the Department of Conservation.

To get on top of a bunch of pests – rats, stoats and possums for a start - they invented an automatic trap that is safe, easy to use, humane and resets itself. Goodnature now has some 50 staff selling products into 20 countries.

## Last month's Speaker - Karen McDonald

The Deputy CEO Consumer NZ spoke of the work of

this long-standing organisation which is dedicated to getting New Zealanders a fairer deal through testing products and services, advising consumers about their rights and how to



exercise them, and campaigning for law changes to benefit consumers.



Consumer NZ has distributed nearly 100,000 "Do Not Knock" stickers since the launch of its campaign to fight back against dodgy doorto-door sellers.
